The investment objective of the fund is to provide diversified exposure to UK and overseas equity markets while reducing foreign currency exposure of 75% of the overseas assets. A 30/70 distribution between UK and overseas assets is maintained with the overseas allocation mirroring that of the FTSE All World (ex UK) Index.

FUND CHARACTERISTICS

The fund achieves its objective by investing in a range of LGIM Index tracking funds. The underlying funds employ an index tracking strategy, aiming to replicate the performance of their individual benchmarks. We follow a pragmatic approach to managing index funds, either investing directly in the securities of that index, or indirectly through other LGIM funds. The funds may also hold index and single stock futures for efficient portfolio management. 75% of the developed market currency exposure, except where arising from holdings in emerging market securities denominated in developed market currencies (e.g. ADRs/GDRs), is hedged back to sterling. Currency hedging is achieved by selling forward for approximately one month the relevant currency exposure of the fund. Currency exposure of any emerging markets will not be hedged.
